FIGURE 1:

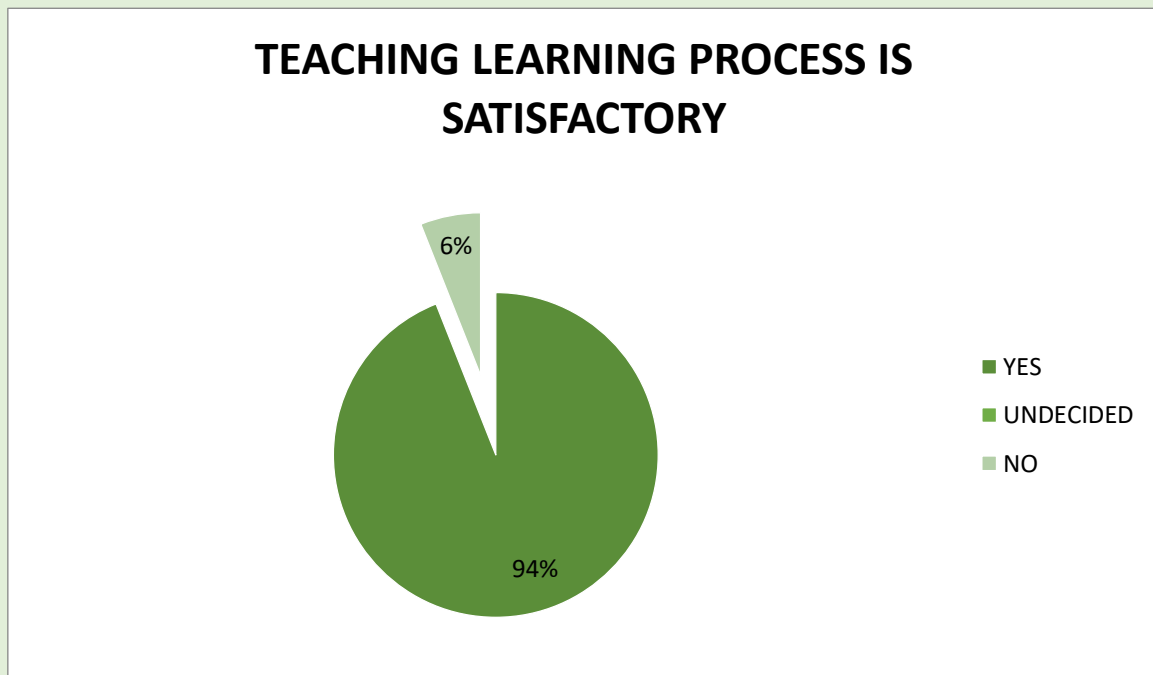


Figure 1: shows that 94% of the respondents are satisfied with the overall teaching-learning process, while 6% of the respondents weren't satisfied.

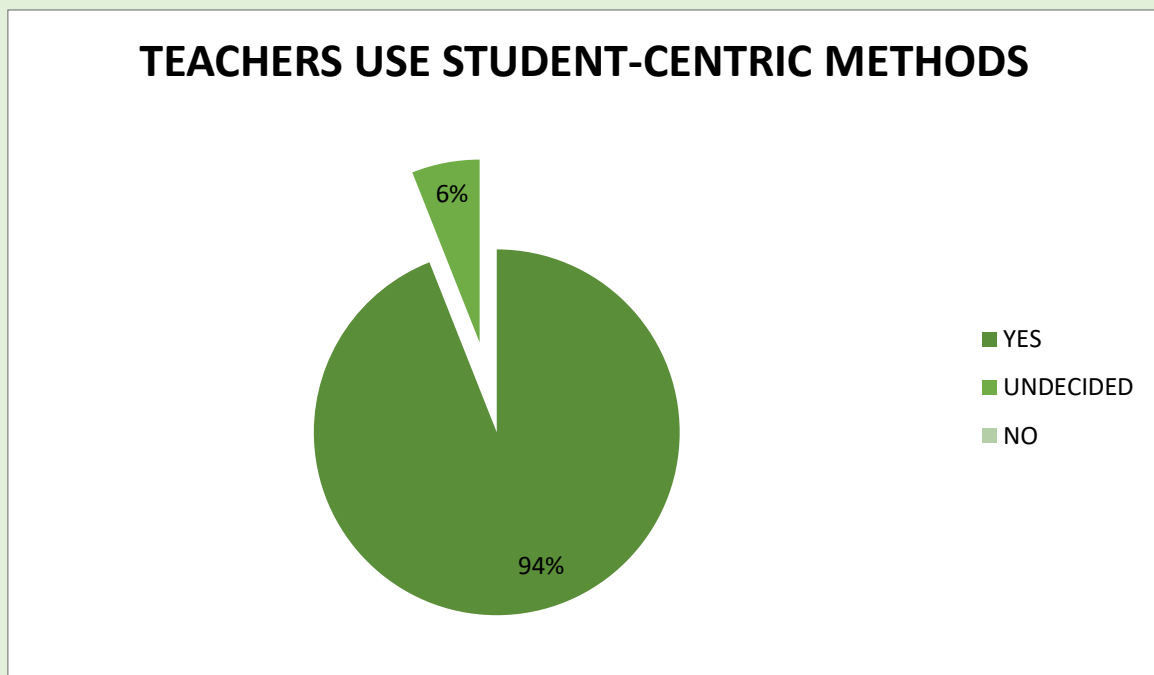


Figure 2: depicts that 94% of the participants agree that teacher use student-centric method to explain the curriculum while 6% of the respondents are undecided.

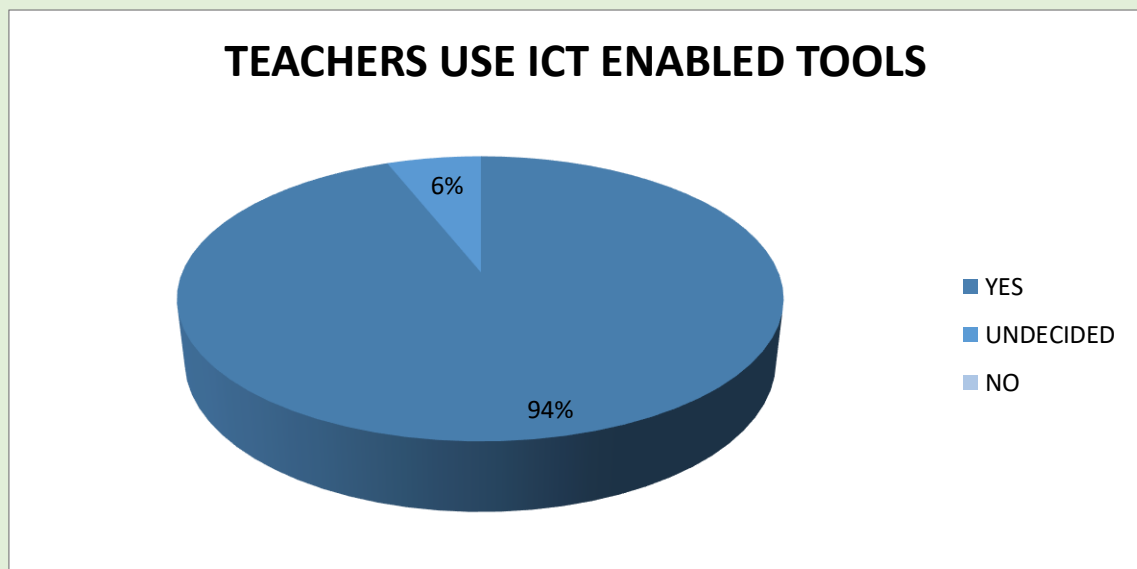


Figure 3: shows that 94% of the alumni members agree the fact that teacher utilize ICT-Enabled tools to aid in the teaching-learning process, while 6% of the member are undecided.

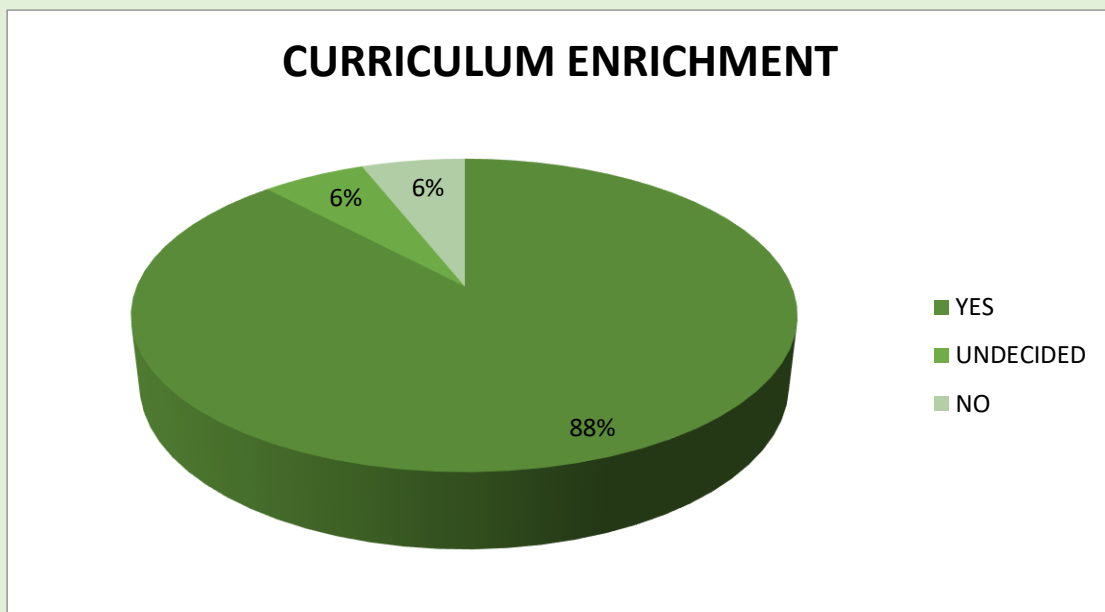


Figure 4: depicts that 88% of the participants are satisfied with the college enriching the curriculum through various add-on course, seminars and workshops, while 6% of them are undecided and 6% disagrees.

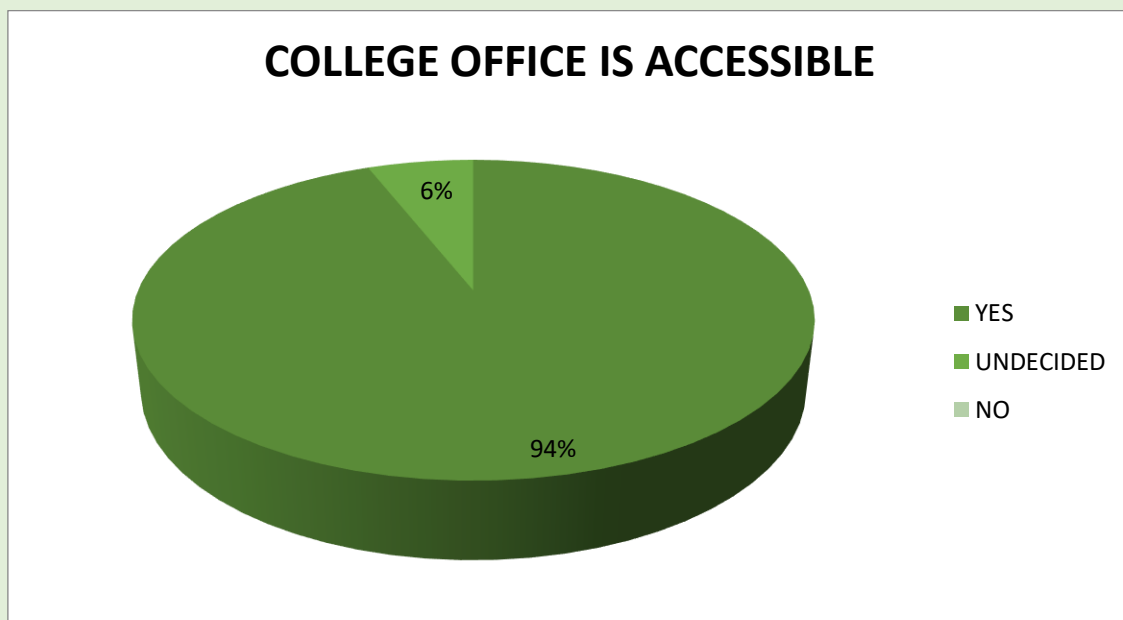


Figure 5: represents that 94% of the alumni members found the college office to be easily accessible while 6% of the member are left undecided on this matter.

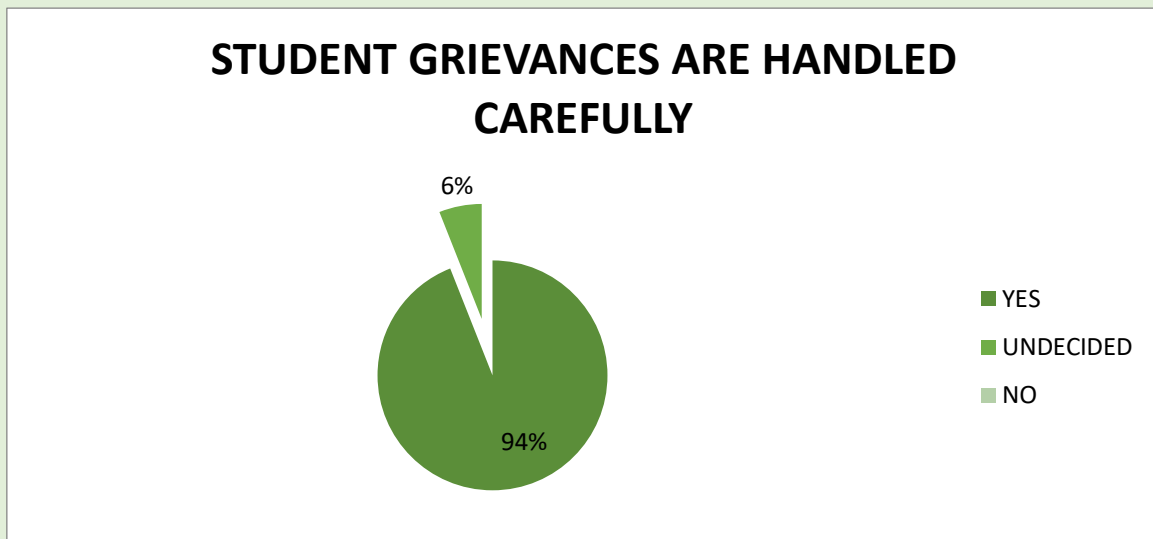


Figure 6: shows that 94% of the respondents agree that the college carefully handles student grievances while 6% of the respondents are left undecided.

FIGURE 7:

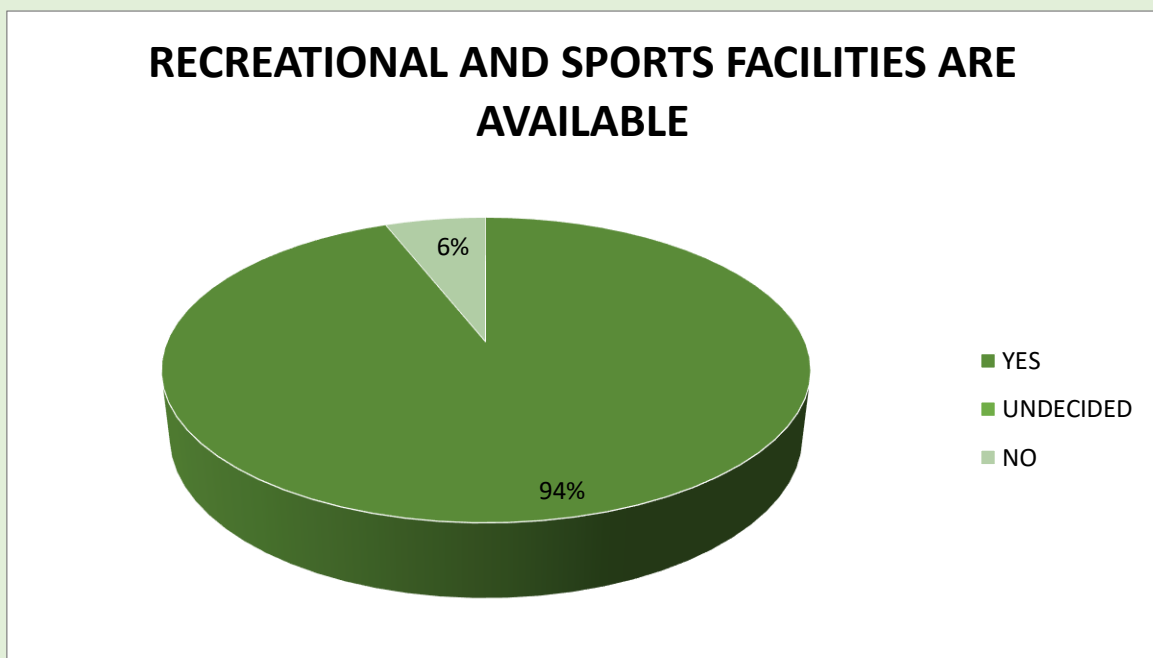


Figure 7: represents that 94% of the alumni members are satisfied with adequate recreational and sports facilities offered by the college, whereas 6% of the members are not fully convinced on this issue.



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Inference:

Through the analysis of Tables 1 to 7, a clear trajectory can be drawn where more than 94% of the alumni members are positively satisfied by the facilities and efforts of the college in raising the standard of education for the holistic development of the students. Though there are also some areas of improvements which were also pointed out by the alumni member. These are as follows:

25% of the respondents felt that the college library and the laboratories required certain upgradation. The next room for improvement was recorded in the field of ICT-enabled facilities where another 25% of the members voiced that it could be further enhanced to meet the current standards. The final areas of improvements were recorded in the college infrastructure, toilets and overall cleanliness of the college with 12.5% each that required regular maintenance and cleaning sessions.

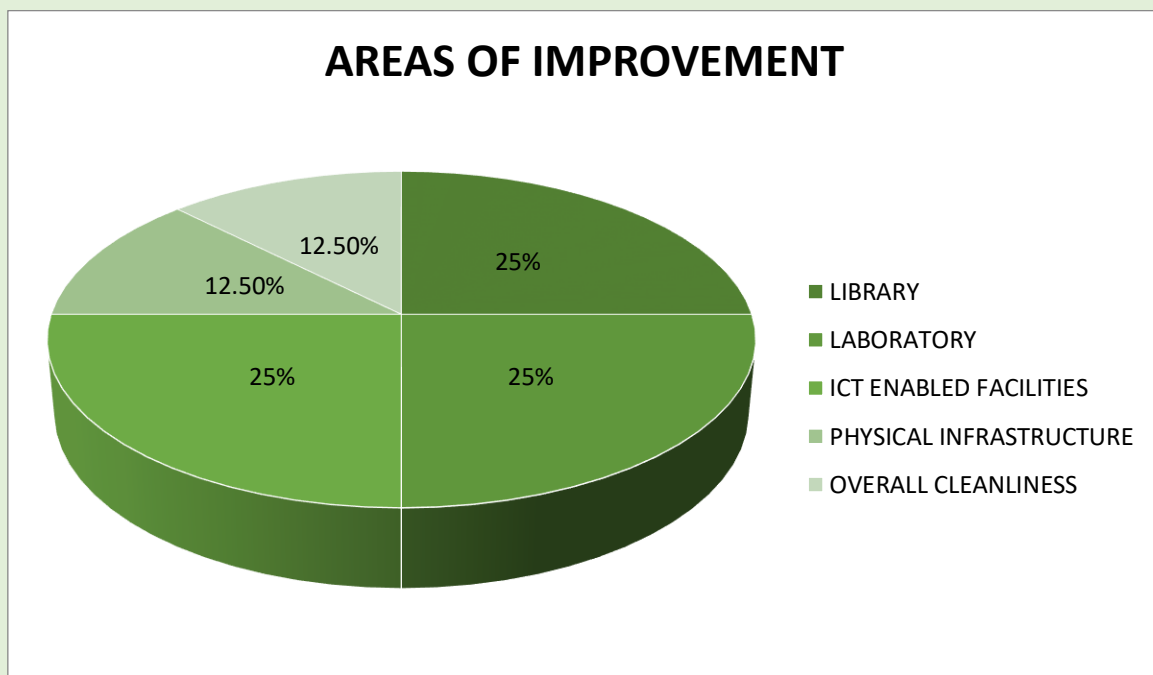


Figure 8: Improvement Percentage

2. Approachability of the college office could be increased and grievance redressal mechanism made more prompt and responsible.
3. Further upgradation of college library, laboratory and ICT- enabled facilities.
4. Improvement and regular maintenance of physical infrastructure and toilets to ensure overall cleanliness.



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
